X. INTRODUCTORY ORDINANCES

5. Prosperous and Affordable

Authorizing the Interim City Manager to execute a lease agreement between the Laredo International Airport and Clear Choice ER located at 5210 Bob Bullock Loop at the Laredo International Passenger Terminal in a space consisting of 400 square feet, constituting a concessions space on the first floor, as depicted in Exhibit A. The purpose of the lease is to operate a COVID-19 Testing Center, providing COVID-19 testing, vaccination, sale, distribution, and/or donations and supplies (as approved by the City Emergency Management Coordinator) for the public. The hours of operations will be from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m., Monday through Saturday. The lease term shall be for one (1) year with one (1) option to renew and base rent shall consist of \$2,000.00 per month.

6. Prosperous and Affordable

Authorizing the Interim City Manager to amend a ground lease agreement between the City of Laredo, as Lessor, and 270 Development Group, as Lessee, approved by Ordinance No. 2022-O-070 dated May 2, 2022, by amending the lease to include language in Section 5.22 granting lessee's future sublessee equal rights and protections once they assume the lease and begin operations. All other terms and conditions remain unchanged and in effect; providing for an effective date.

7. Prosperous and Affordable

Authorizing the Interim City Manager to amend a lease agreement between the City of Laredo, as Lessor, and 270 Development Group, as Lessee, approved by Ordinance No. 2022-O-070 dated May 2, 2022, by amending the lease to include language in Section 3.02 by extending the period for commencement of construction from 3 months to 6 months and by amending Sections 8.01 and 12.25, by adding language to include the words "or Sublessee" after the word "LESSEE", granting lessee's future Sublessee rights once they assume the lease and begin operations. This contract provides the Fleet Department with the ability to outsource and expedite needed services for the City's pothole patcher trucks and vacuum trucks for the Public Works & Utilities Departments. Cooper Equipment is proposing a 19% increase due to an increase in labor and fuel costs. The term of this contract shall be for a period of one (1) year beginning as of the date of its execution and is contingent upon the availability of appropriated funds. This contract can be extended for two (2) additional one (1) year periods, upon mutual agreement of the parties. All parts and services will be secured on an as-needed basis. Funding is available in the Fleet Maintenance Budget.
