The estimated value for each tiny home is \$10,000.00 for a total donated value of \$80,000.00.

The current construction contract amount including this change order is \$7,473,848.49 and the construction contract time is 556 calendar days. We received approval from TxDOT to proceed with the change order. Funding is available in the Bridge Fund-Construction Budget.

Consideration for approval of FY22-ENG-16 CDBG Sidewalks – District IV (8 Blocks) including Phase I & Phase II as complete, approval of change order No. 1, release of retainage and approval of final payment in the amount of \$52,712.50 to ALC Construction, Inc., Laredo, Texas. Final construction contract amount is \$239,125.00. Funding is available in 2019, 2020, and 2021 CDBG Grants.

 - b. Section II The Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company, Akron, Ohio, in an amount up to \$150,000.00 (Primary Vendor)
 - c. Southern Tire Mart, Laredo, Texas, in an amount up to \$125,000.00 (Secondary Vendor).

All tires will be secured on an as-needed basis. The term of this contract shall be for a period of one (1) year beginning as of the date of its execution and is contingent upon the availability of appropriated funds. Due to an industry wide increase on rubber materials cost, Southern Tire Mart is proposing a 14% increase and the Goodyear Tire Company is proposing a 10% increase in pricing during this extension period.
