

Current contract amount with this amendment is \$623,890.00. Funding is available in the 2016 Certificate of Obligation and District VIII & District IV Priority Funds.
- 29. Consideration to award construction contract FY23-ENG-08 to the lowest responsible, responsive bidder ALC Construction Co., Inc., Laredo, Texas, in an amount not to exceed \$83,200.00 for the City of Laredo Speed Tables at Various Street Locations Project, and authorizing the Interim City Manager to execute all related contract documents contingent upon receipt and approval of insurance and bond documents. This contract shall be for a period of one year and may be extended for an additional one (1) year period upon mutual agreement of the parties. Funding is available in 2022 Certificate of Obligation Bond District V Priority Funding.

30. Consideration for approval of change order No. 2, an increase of \$30,000.00, and an increase of 206 calendar days for project completion to a construction contract with Celso Gonzalez Construction, Inc., Mission, Texas., for the Fasken Community Center Pool & Amenities Project including the tree house and water feature. In addition, the City of Laredo will assist Studio Cortes in providing in-kind services in the estimated amount of \$20,000.00, for scaffolding, ready-mix concrete (3.5 cubic yards), concrete pump sprayer, workforce (2-3 staff members), and housing (3 months) to complete the project. Current total contract amount including this change order is \$577,508.60, and contract time of 962 calendar days. Proposed commencement date is December 12, 2022, and estimated completion date is March 30, 2023. Funding is available in the 2014 CO Bond and 2016 CO Bond.

Vendor pricing is under BuyBoard Cooperative Contract 603-20. All units have to be fully equipped with rescue equipment and other parts for emergency calls. This contract is for one year. Funding is available in the Fire Department Budget.

This contract provides the Fleet Department with the ability to outsource out and expedite needed services for small and medium vehicle repairs. The term of this contract shall be for a period of one (1) year beginning as of the date of its execution and is contingent upon the availability of appropriated funds. This contract can be renewed three (3) additional one (1) year extension periods, upon mutual agreement of the parties. All parts and services will be secured on an as-needed basis. Funding is available in the Fleet Maintenance Budget.

- 34. Consideration to award contract FY23-015 for the general diesel engine repairs and parts/service for the City's Fleet Department to the low bidders:
 - 1. Cervantes Truck Center, Laredo, Texas in an amount up to \$350,000.00 (Primary Vendor); and
 - 2. Rush Truck Center, Laredo, Texas in an amount up to \$100,000.00 (Secondary Vendor); and
 - 3. Rotex Truck Center, Laredo, Texas in an amount up to \$100,000.00 (Secondary Vendor); and
 - 4. South Texas Auto Rebuilders, Laredo, Texas in an amount up to \$100,000.00 (Secondary Vendor).

This contract establishes multiple vendors for general diesel engine repairs. This contract provides the Fleet Department with the ability to outsource and expedite needed diesel engine repairs. The term of this contract shall be for a period of one (1) year beginning as of the date of its execution and is contingent upon the availability of appropriated funds and compliance city code of ordinances. This contract can be renewed three (3) additional one (1) year extension periods, upon mutual agreement of the parties. Funding is available in the Fleet Maintenance budget.
