X. INTRODUCTORY ORDINANCES

- Authorizing the City Manager to execute a Lease Agreement between the City of Laredo (Lessor) and Patmo Services, LLC (Lessee) for the purpose of placing thereon radio/two-way transmission equipment on the LBJ Water Tank site located off Loop 20 at Cuatro Vientos, within an area at the top of the water tank where communication antennas can be mounted, and a radio equipment cabinet placed in the base of the tower. The initial term of this lease shall be for a period of ten years commencing December 1, 2023, and ending on the tenth anniversary of the Commencement Date (the Term). Jarvis Avenue at the Laredo International Airport. Monthly rent shall increase from \$11,667.55 to \$12,425.32. Additionally amending the lease term to include two options to renew for an additional five years each, ending on September 30, 2046, and September 30, 2051. All other terms and conditions remain unchanged and in effect; providing for severability; providing for an effective date.

14. Authorizing the City Manager to execute an amendment to the lease agreement between City of Laredo, as LESSOR, and General Services Administration (GSA), as LESSEE, approved by Ordinance No. 2020-O-094 dated August 03, 2020 for approximately 1,533 square feet constituting office space occupied by the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) located at 5210 Bob Bullock Loop at the Laredo International Airport.
