Plans approved as re-submitted. Plans indicate on cover sheet that the 2012 International Fire Code will be followed. Plans also indicate that a 13 D multi-purpose fire sprinkler system will be installed. If any automatic gates are installed they shall be provided with an emergency means of operation (SOS) to allow for fire department access and are a minimum of 20 feet when fully open. If property is completely fenced in, then it will require a 4 ft. pedestrian gate. Smoke detectors must be interconnected and must be no closer than 3 feet from any duct or ceiling fan. A type 1A10BC portable fire extinguisher (2.5 lb.) shall be provided and mounted in every unit that will be sprinklered and a 2A10BC portable fire extinguisher (5 lb.) for the single unit that will not be sprinklered and must also be tagged by a licensed fire extinguisher Company.
